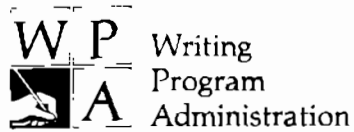

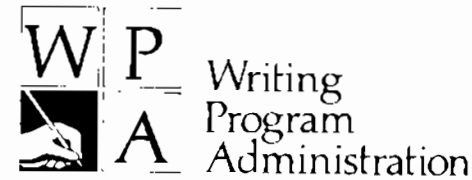

Article length (flexible), 2-4,000 words. Authors should submit two copies and retain a copy for their own files. Material should be suitably documented using the *MLA Handbook, 2nd Edition* although as much reference as possible should be included within the text. Annotated bibliographies accompanying articles are encouraged, as well as any other apparatus which might make material more conceptually and practically valuable to working writing program administrators. The editors reserve the right to edit manuscripts accepted for publication to conform with the style of the journal. Article deadlines: fall-winter issue, January 15; spring issue, September 15. Relevant announcements are also acceptable. Announcement deadlines: fall-winter issue, October 1; spring issue, January 5. Address contributions and editorial correspondence to William E.
