Notes: When we receive a manuscript, one of us sends it out to two EB members , for review (we have a standard form for reviewers).												
We try to match-up the focus of a manuscript with the interests our EB members have expressed, but that's not always possible.												
We have a very large Editorial Board, so people only have to do one or so manuscripts per year. Most are very responsive.												
Rarely, we have to remind reviewers that they owe us their comments, or assign an essay to a third reader.												
Once we get reviewer comments back, we make a decision on whether or not to ask the author to revise. If we decide to ask for a revision, we synthesize the reviewer comments and also send those comments to the author. We do not give deadlines for revisions.												
If we decide to reject, we again synthesize the comments but generally do NOT send reviewer comments to the author of a rejected mss.												
We also try to decide at this point whether or not the mss. will again be sent for review, once we have a revision in-hand.												
Once we accept the mss., we send it along to our copy editing folks.
